## 2. FERC Observation-Only Checklist

If you aren't already actively participating in the FERC process, you should at least sign up for FERC's automatic notifications to have access to the documents and arguments filed there. A quick web search should help you identify if a project is still in the pre-file stage or if it has advanced to the application stage already.
