### What is a Quality Assurance Project Plan(QAPP)?

- EPA Definition: A QAPP is a planning document related to a project that describes in comprehensive detail the necessary QA/QC requirements and other technical activities that must be implemented to ensure that the results of the work performed will satisfy the stated performance and acceptance criteria
- More simply: A QAPP is a plan with sufficient details on planning, implementation and assessment to support the outcomes of the project.

## Why do you need a Quality Assurance Project Plan(QAPP)?


- Required for all EPA funded environmental information operations (data collection)
- Projects benefit from planning
- A QAPP provides connection between what the workplan says and how the work will be accomplished
- It gets the project team and the EPA on the same page
- Makes you consider how your project decisions will be supported Provides Confidence!


